# June 2 Public Transit & Housing: A Virtuous Relationship?

New investment in major public transit infrastructure is usually funded, in part, from property development fees along the public transit corridor. Thus, expensive investments tend to lead to expensive new housing. In Vancouver, the planned Broadway subway, including the proposed extension to UBC, is a high-cost transit solution that may well result in new housing along its corridor that is unaffordable for people living and working in the city.

Patrick Condon has long argued for less costly transit solutions that support more livable neighbourhoods and affordable housing. He will take us through the case for a Broadway subway.
