

Clare Marie Buckland (1914-2009)

She was a helper and mentor to many:

- *as the principal at York House (1958-1964)
- *as the assistant to Rev. Phillip Hewett
- *as a Jungian analyst and educator
- *as active developing West Side Family Place

She received the YWCA award for Women of Distinction in 1992 She wrote 2 books:

Always Becoming: An Autobiography

And Always Becoming: Forever!

"a remarkably honest and human account of what it means to prepare for conscious dying... and ultimately, for conscious living."

At 54, she enrolled in a doctoral program at the University of California where she won a three-year international fellowship from the American Association of University Women. After working as an educator, consultant and therapist, Buckland trained in Jungian Psychology, graduating in 1975 from the Inter-Regional Society of Jungian Analysts.
