**FORUM:** The UCV Board presents: Filling the gaps for Phase 2 of the redevelopment research. Task groups will be struck to research items not covered in the Phase 2 proposal, including "What happens if we don't go forward with redevelopment", which will include proposal for a depreciation report and collection of existing records from B&G. Other proposals may include application for a housing co-op. Additional ideas or identification of gaps will be sought at the Forum, with the understanding that volunteers to undertake the tasks will be a necessary part of the discussion.

**NEW ART EXHIBITION:** M. Carscience: *The Light of All Things*. A collection of abstract light paintings. The images are made with a technique the artist calls "experimental optics," curious experiments with digital photography and disassembled camera lens parts, which transforms the light of our illuminated environment into tableaus that challenge perceptions and invite the imagination to explore new realms.

#### Children and Youth on Sundays

Everyone begins the morning together in the sanctuary for the first 10-15 minutes of worship through the *Story for All Ages*. The First Sunday of each month everyone remains in the Sanctuary for worship together (nursery care is available during all-ages services), 2<sup>nd</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> Sundays children (up to 12) and youth (13-19) continue their Explorations across the courtyard in Hewett Centre.

Responsible adults must pick up children under age 9 from their classroom at 12:15, Youth Group runs until 12:30, older children and youth will be released to meet their family in the hall for coffee hour. You may join your child in Explorations, but we encourage giving them their own time whenever possible.

Orange: Toddler Watch--attending to babies and children under 4 within the Children's Program.

Green: Children's Program Leaders and Assistants

Yellow: Youth Advisers

**Children and babies** are always welcome in our worship services. To parents and responsible adults, we offer some tips to help you and your children be at ease:

- Mother Nature put the wiggle in children; don't feel you have to suppress it in our church.
- Sit towards the front where your child can see what is going on; backs of heads are boring! Help your child by being a role model.
- Gently and quietly explain what is going on, how people are listening or participating.
- Answer your child's questions with a quiet whisper—they often whisper back.
- Encourage your child to work with their 'Buddy Bag' to help them concentrate on worship.
- If your child needs to leave the service, please feel free to come back. We believe children belong in sacred spaces.
- The service can also be heard in the foyer and in Hewett Hall where a playroom is open for your use.

\*The John Gibbard Memorial Award is presented annually by the Vancouver Branch of the UN Association in Canada in recognition and memory of John Gibbard who was a supporter of the League of Nations from its creation in 1919, in the wake of the First World War. When the League ceased to exist, John Gibbard continued to support the ideals upon which the League had been founded. When the United Nations was formed after the Second World War, he became an active member of the UN Association in Canada. He was dedicated to involving youth in the creation of a better world for all.

The Award is given to youth up to 25 years of age in recognition of their dedication and commitment to working for humanity and a better world locally or internationally.

#### Nominees or candidates:

- must be residents of the Metro Vancouver area
- may be individuals or groups
- cannot self-nominate
- must be nominated by a non-relative
- must be under 25 years old
- should exemplify the values of good citizenship and personal qualities of a humanitarian
- Candidates should have taken actions of both or either local and international nature

This year's award recipient is **Andrew Sheroubi.** 



Andrew is deeply passionate about global humanitarian causes. As a Chemical and Biological engineering student at UBC, he was very involved with a variety of organizations such as Engineers Without Borders (EWB) and the Canadian Red Cross. He was president of the UBC Red Cross club for two years and is the current director (and one of the founders) of the Red Cross Student Movement (RCSM), a student led initiative aimed at empowering the community to take action on local and global issues. During his final year, Andrew created and ran APSC 498H, an Impact of Technology on Society course on humanitarian engineering. He also worked on designing a modular water treatment system for both remote First Nation's communities and disaster response situations. In his spare time Andrew enjoys reading, cooking and trying to find the ever elusive work-life balance.
